Judges Profiles

My love of Great Danes began in 1975 when as a young Veterinary Nurse I had to look after a really nice brindle called Julius who had broken his Femur and had undergone extensive surgery. He was only 12 months old but his gentleness and determination won me over and from then on I was hooked on the breed.

A couple of years later we had an adult fawn brought in to the surgery. He was a very big male, approximately 3-4 years old and in very poor condition. He had been dumped in the countryside on the outskirts of Swindon wearing just a collar with the name 'Andromedus' on it. He was picked up by an old man and brought in so it didn't take much for me to persuade my dad to have him and so it began! We called him 'Drum' and he lived for 3 very happy years, dying in his sleep in front of a big log fire one winter's morning.

It wasn't long before another fawn, 'Bodie' joined the family from the famous Ansetts kennel and then shortly afterwards a brindle bitch from the Oakhatch kennel.

Unfortunately my dad died in the early 80's and so I had to wait until I had a settled homelife before I could have another Dane. In 1994 my partner at the time's family had also had danes and so together we bought a lovely fawn bitch from John Hunter 'Khunrath Kajeeva' aka Taz. She was sired by 'CH Dorneywood Ymir' and had a reasonably successful show career. I then purchased another fawn bitch from John and in fact all of my danes since have been line-bred to the Khunrath and Garsak lines.

From my second litter, I line bred a bitch that was bred by Alan Cutter, Dapledan Star Attraction, to Hilary Baker's 'Toscade Total Eclipse at Preveli' and that produced 'CH Calomar Total Stardom', or Drummer as he was affectionately known. He had the most fantastic temperament and a beautiful head with a full black mask. He was mated to 'CH Garsak Blaze' and this produced 'CH Garsak Sir Alfie' and of course my favourite boy 'Garsak Sir Franklyn'. Another mating with Drummer to Sheen Booth's 'CH Roucandane Tiger Dawn' produced the fabulous 'Miller'. Drummer's litter sister was mated to Tantallon Celtic Advocate at Baadswood and this litter produced two beautiful bitches, 'CH Calomar Chasing Dreams for Lijensa' and 'Calomar Ruby Rock Star' who we tragically and very suddenly lost a month before her 3rd birthday with Peritonitis. I must admit following this I was heartbroken and felt like I couldn't show any more. It was only after about 6 months that a little brindle bitch was given to me by Sheena, 'Roucandane Razzle Dazzle' aka Brodie and so I entered her into a few shows and gradually the loss of Ruby began to fade. Brodie was mated to 'CH Jaydania Fred Astaire' which produced 'Calomar Chasing Stardom', Boris who gained 1CC and is now living happily in retirement with his colleague in crime Jaydania Tenna See (1 RCC).

My love for the breed is as strong as ever and I would like to thank the Great Dane Club for the opportunity to judge males at their Open show. I am really looking forward to going over some lovely dogs.

I first started Judging in 1982 and have made up several Champions in two breeds and handled others to their titles and Top Dogs, Top Puppies, Bred a BOB and a Best Puppy at Crufts in Briards and had the pleasure to Judge the Breed at Crufts in 2018. Had a BOB in OES at Crufts and 4th in the Working Group before the split to Pastoral

First judged Great Danes, in 2002 and several times since and really looking forward to Judging my second Club Show the first Midland & West Club Show, Colour format and had a terrific entry

I am passed to Award CCs in BMD, Leos, and two more pending Subject to KC Approval. I have judged over thirty Working Groups at Open Shows and am on several A3 and B lists within the Working Group. DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show Award that counts towards the title of Champion under the Rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club. Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows. In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of postal entries shall be counted when entering for any class i.e. **FRIDAY 19TH OCTOBER 2018.** Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes but when entering for Variety classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. A first prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value.

If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:-

- (1) WITHDRAWAL. The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulations 9(j) and 20.
- (2) TRANSFER. a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and, in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted to the Open class for the correct, colour, sex, weight or height.
 - b) If an exhibit is entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy Class, Puppy Class or Junior Class, which is over age but under 12 calendar months of age, 18 calendar months of age or 24 calendar months of age respectively the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy Class, Junior Class or Yearling Class respectively for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling Class to the Open Class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.

If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

MINOR PUPPY: For dogs of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

PUPPY: For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

JUNIOR: For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

YEARLING: For dogs of twelve and not exceeding twenty four calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

NOVICE: For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or a three or more First Prizes at Open and Championship Shows (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not).

POST GRADUATE: For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or five or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Graduate, Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not where challenge certificates were offered for the breed.

LIMIT For dogs which have not become show Champions under the Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club, or won 3 or more CACIB/CAC/Green Stars or won 7 or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit or Open Classes confined to the Breed, whether restricted or not at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

OPEN: For all dogs of the breed for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.

SPECIAL VETERAN: For dogs of not less than six years of age on the first day of the Show.

SPECIAL OPEN: For all dogs of the breed for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show, but restricted to colour.

NOT FOR COMPETITION: The Society will accept Not for Competition entries for the Show. These entreis will only be accepted for Great Danes, howevery at the discretion of the show society a dog brought into the show by a spectator may be admitted into the precincts of the show with the proviso that those in charge of the dog sign a declaration confirming the dog is free from disease and that the dog will be kept under proper control at all times F(1) 3.57 para 11. NB Puppies aged four caledar months and over are eligible to enter NFC at this show.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1. The Show will open at 9.00 a.m.
- 2. Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitors responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required 10.00 a.m.
- 4. Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. The Show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed.
- 5. **ENTRY FEÉS:** Members £7.00 First Entry Per Dog; Subsequent Entries with same Dog £1.50.;Non Members £8.50First Entry Per Dog, Subsequent Entries will same Dog £2.00. Not for Competition £3.00; **Membership Renewal** £8.00 single, £9.00 joint.
- 6. **PRIZE MONEY:** No Prize Money will be paid at this Show.
- 7. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
- 8. Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition.
- 9. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.

10. Best Puppy in Show

Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same show. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best in Show is a puppy it should automatically be awarded Best Puppy in Show. Where the Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it should also automatically be Best Puppy in Show. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best in Show.

11. Best in Show

Best in Show must be selected from the exhibits declared Best of Sex but only if they have received a first prize in a class at the same show. If a Reserve Best in Show is to be selected, the eligible dogs are those declared Best Opposite Sex and Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show.

- 12. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.
- 13. Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them nor handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not touch the ground when on the move. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.
- 14. All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
- 15. All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
- 16. DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS. Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events. o When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams. o If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all. o The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.

Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog. When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.

Keep the dog in the shade - take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.

Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time. Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare. WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILILTY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.

Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. Right to Refuse Entries. Exhibitors/Competitors are reminded that show societies have the right under Kennel Club Regulation to refuse any entry.

17. Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under the Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. The use of pinch collars, electronic shock

- collars, or prong collars, is not permitted at any show licensed by the Kennel Club. This shall apply at the venue or within the precincts of the show.
- 18. Not for competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entryform and must be Kennel Club Registered.
- 19. No modifications will be made to the schedule except by permission of the General Committee of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine press wherever possible.
- 20. Vicious dogs are not eligible and must not be brought to the Show. Exhibitors are held responsible for any damage done by their dogs during the exhibition.

TRADE STANDS: some space is still available, please contact the Show Manager.

The Committee can accept no responsibility for products advertised or sold by stand holders at the Show and wish to remind exhibitors that grooming products on sale may not meet the requirements of The Regulation for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.

EXERCISE AREA: An exercise area will be provided. Exhibitors and Handler are requested to clear up and foulding by dogs in their charge.

WARNING NOTICE

All persons attending the Dog Show must compensate and/or indemnify the organisers for the loss or damage to any property or buildings with the show ground caused with or without negligence by any person under the age of 18 years who is brought by them to the Dog Show or for whom they are responsible.

WHAT IS A BACK TO BACK SHOW?

Both The Great Dane Club and the Great Dane Breeders' & Owners' Association will be running their own shows but they will both be held at the same venue in the same hall. This means that you can attend both shows but only pay one lot of travelling expenses.

HOW WILL THE SHOW BE RUN?

Both clubs have worked hard together to arrange the show so that you can get the best out of each of the shows and not miss any classes.

THERE WILL BE TWO RINGS?

The Great Dane Club will start with Bitches and The Great Dane Breeders' & Owners' Association will start with Dogs.

HOW DO I ENTER BOTH SHOWS?

Simply complete each club's entry form in the normal way and send it to the addresses shown on each to the entry forms with your payment made payable to each respective club. Kennel Club rules mean that we cannot combine the entry and payment process for you so please ensure that you send the relevant form to the right show manager.

DO I NEED TWO CATALOGUES?

Unfortunately you will need to purchase one for each show, i.e. one for The Great Dane Club and one for The Great Dane Breeders' & Owners' Association. This is a directive from The Kennel Club although we are working on this with them and hope that at some point in the future we may be able to combine it.

THE GREAT DANE BREED COUNCIL

It has been brought to the Council's attention that the temperament in Great Danes is deteriorating. Therefore this notification will be in Schedules and Catalogues. It is intented as a guide to both Judges and Exhibitors.

K.C. Rule 15 - Exclusion of Dogs

If in the opinion of the Show Secretary, Show Manager or Judge any dog is considered not in a fit state for exhibition owing to disease, savage disposition or any other cause, the dog may be excluded from the Show on the instruction of the Show management. Once excluded or removed from the Show the dog must not be brought into the Show at any time under any circumstances and the case must be reported in full to the Kennel Club within 7 days.

Judges may send the dog out if the dog appears to have an aggressive disposition. Extract from Kennel Club Regulations F(1) reproduced with their permission.

The Kennel Club.

REGULATIONS FOR THE PREPARATION OF DOGS FOR EXHIBITION F(B)

- These Regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for exhibition and/or exhibited at
 any Kennel Club Licensed event. Objections may be referred to the General Committee for
 disciplinary action under these Show Regulations and/or for disciplinary action under Kennel Club
 Rule A 42.
 - (a) A dog found to have been exhibited in breach of these Regulations will automatically be disqualified from exhibition at the show and from any award gained there at.
 - (b) Unless the exhibitor provides a satisfactory explanation for the dog being exhibited in breach of these Regulations then he/she may be subject to further penalties of either a fine or as listed under Rule A42.
- 2. a) No substance which alters the natural colour, texture or body of the coat may be present in the dog's coat for any purpose at any time during the Show. No substance which alters the natural colour of any external part of the dog may be present at any time during the Show.
 - b) Any other substance (other than water) which may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition must not be allowed to remain in the coat or on any other part of the dog at the time of exhibition.
- 3. No act or operation which alters the natural conformation of a dog or any part thereof may be performed except:-
 - (a) Operations certified to the satisfaction of the General Committee.
 - (b) The removal of dew claws of any breed.
 - (c) Operations to prevent breeding provided that such operations are notified to the Kennel Club before neutered dogs are shown.

Nor must anything be done calculated in the opinion of the General Committee to deceive.

- 4. The General Committee without previous notice may order an examination of any dog or dogs at any Show. Any examination thus ordered will be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from the Kennel Club in their possession. Samples may be taken for further examination and analysis.
- 5. An individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner or handler of a dog competing in the same breed or class. An objection may however, be lodged by an official of the Show or by anyone so deputed by the K.C. It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodges the objection or the official (as appropriate), to substantiate the grounds for the objection. The Kennel Club will substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its behalf.
 - Any objection by an individual related to an infringement of these Regulations must be made in writing to the Show Secretary at his/her
 - office before the close of the Show and the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint
- 6. Any objection by an individual related to an infringement of these Regulations must be made in writing to the Show Secretary at his/her office before the close of the Show and the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint.
